



**G**eorge Mac Barclay, 83, of Bozeman, passed away April 18, 2010. He was born September 8, 1926 in Livingston, Montana to George Washington and Lelia Pearl (McGuire) Barclay, at the Heltenberg Home.

The family lived in Livingston where his father worked for the railroad shops. At the age of two, they moved to Belgrade where he attended schools, graduating in 1947, after missing part of several years due to rheumatic fever.

He enjoyed stock car racing - the Eight Ball; ice and open water fishing of rivers, streams, and lakes; motorcycling in the mountains and back country of Montana, Utah, and Arizona; skiing at Bridger Bowl, Big Sky, Pine Hill, Lionhead, and Bear Canyon; boating at Canyon Ferry, Hebgen Lake, Lake Powell, Yellowtail, and Yellowstone; traveling and camping; and spending winters in Arizona and California.

George is survived by his wife, Carol, of Bozeman, and by numerous cousins, nieces and nephews.
