



Lucile Elizabeth Moats, 89, died in Idaho Falls, Idaho, on May 31, 2007, at the home of her son, Tim, from complications of Alzheimer's disease.

Lucile was born May 10, 1918, in Center Junction, Iowa, to John and Grace Livingstone. She attended the University of Iowa and Iowa State Teacher's College at Cedar Falls.

She taught school for two years in Maynard, Iowa, and then served on the faculty of the West Branch Schools.
