



Harold R. Mueller, age 90, passed away peacefully Friday, June 18, at Mountain View Care Center surrounded by his family and friends. Harold was born June 24, 1919, in Rosebud, ND to Rudolph and Martha Hoesel Mueller. He attended school in Mandan and later moved to Jamestown, ND.

Harold served in the U.S. Army during World War II in the Pacific Theater from February 1942 to June 1945.

While serving in the Army his medals include a Bronze Star, Silver Star, and 3 purple hearts.

On August 21, 1945, Harold married the love of his life, Helen Scott in Jamestown. He attended watchmakers' school and later moved to Billings, MT where he was employed as a watchmaker for Ray Moore.

In 1950, they moved to Bozeman where he was employed as a jeweler and watchmaker at Miller's Jewelry. They later purchased the store and owned it until retirement in 1988.

Harold was a Mason, and a Shriner belonging to the Scooter Patrol, the Elks, the American Legion, and the Antique Car Club. He was one of the founders of the Valley View Golf Course.

Some of Harold's talents included woodworking, auto repair, and home construction. There was never a thing that he couldn't design, build or repair. He loved hunting, fishing and being outdoors. He enjoyed building his cabin which his father-in-law lovingly called "Camp Never Rest".

Survivors include his wife, Helen; his two children, Jim (Pat) Mueller of Minnesota and Barbara (David) Doerr of Idaho. He is also survived by four grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; two sisters, Amanda Gumpke and Vistora Anderson of Jamestown, ND and brother, Walter, of Fremont, NE, numerous nieces and nephews, and his beloved Boston Terrier, Buttons.
