



Carrie Louise Bare, 91, of Bozeman passed away October 14, 2008. She was born July 6, 1917 in Glade Spring, Virginia to William Edward and Margaret Amelia (Owens) Cullip.

Louise moved to Montana at an early age and lived with her sister and brother-in-law on their ranches in the Reed Point and Columbus area. She worked on the ranches and finished her elementary education in Reed Point. She met Tam Bare and they married in Big Timber in 1935. They moved to Livingston in 1936 and bought a small dairy farm. Together with Tam's brother, Donald, they ran the dairy for twenty-nine years. They sold whole milk and ran a delivery route in town all the years they ran the dairy. They made many friends who became loyal customers and were very well known in the community.

They raised two sons, Shad Bare and Montie Bare, on the ranch. They retired and sold the dairy in the early '60's and moved to Lolo, Montana. In June of 1973, they moved to Bozeman and lived there the remainder of their lives.
