



Edward Wiley Hinman, 92, of Bozeman passed away on Oct. 8, 2010, in Townsend, MT. He was born April 11, 1918, in Solen, Sioux county, North Dakota. He grew up on a farm, the second son of Hugh Milford and Marion Wiley Hinman. He enjoyed working with teams of horses as he worked on the farm. He excelled in track in high school and served in the Civilian Conservation Corps after high school.

At the age of 20, he moved to Bozeman, MT, and got a job working for a rancher by the name of Edward Reiser. In 1939, he married the rancher's daughter, Dorothy Reiser, they farmed and ranched in the Bozeman area raising 5 son's. In 1970, they moved into Bozeman, Ed working for Gallatin Farmers. He also worked for the City of Bozeman, and later as a fertilizer spreader for Rocky Mountain Supply, retiring at the age of 86. Ed lost his beloved wife, Dorothy, in 2005. He resided at Highgate in Bozeman, then moved to Townsend, MT in July 2010.
