

Alfred Day, 86, passed away January 15, 2010. Alfred was a former Professor and Assistant Dean of the College of Business, at Montana State University.

Al was born in Garrison, Montana and grew up in Philipsburg. He served in the Air Force during WWII and was stationed in the Pacific. He received degrees from the University of Montana and the University of Minnesota. He taught high school in Stanford, Lewistown, Dillon, and Anaconda before beginning at the Department of Business at Montana State College in 1957. Al taught accounting, business law, and was the Assistant Dean of the College of Business until his retirement in 1985. He was a wildlife artist who had taught himself to paint at an early age. He continued to paint into his retirement.
